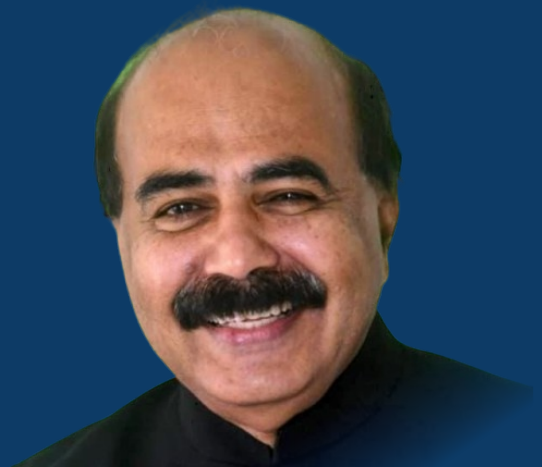

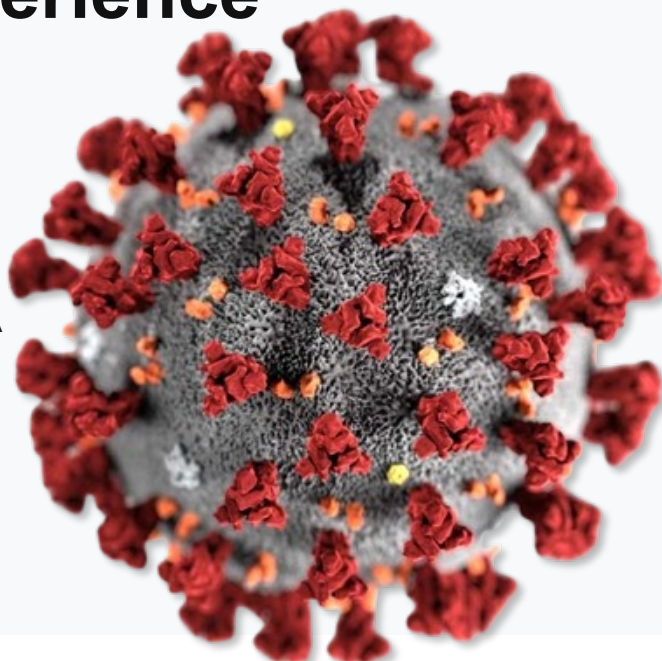

About the workshop

The COVID-19 pandemic has resulted in significant long-term health consequences among survivors, commonly referred to as Post COVID Condition (PCC) or Long COVID. These sequelae affect physical, psychological, and social well-being, thereby impacting the quality of life of individuals and placing additional burdens on healthcare systems. There is a growing need for evidence-based public health interventions, integrated care approaches, and multidisciplinary research initiatives to address the long-term implications of COVID-19. This dissemination workshop aims to share the findings of the project and discuss policy implications, clinical experiences, and future directions for improving health-related quality of life among COVID-19 survivors.

Objectives

- To disseminate the major findings of the Post COVID Condition research project.
- To discuss the burden, predictors, and health-related quality of life associated with PCC.
- To explore policy implications and public health strategies for managing PCC.
- To facilitate multidisciplinary discussions among academicians, clinicians, researchers, and policymakers.
- To identify future research priorities and collaborative opportunities in PCC management.
