1. Preface

This prospectus is published for admission to the Master of Public Health (Health System Management, Epidemiology and Global Health) (MPH- HSMEGH) Programme with specializations in Health System Management, Epidemiology and Global Health conducted by Kerala University of Health Sciences (KUHS). The programme is a two-year full time programme conducted at School of Public Health (SPH), Kerala University of Health Sciences (KUHS), Medical college campus, Thiruvananthapuram. The prospectus contains general information and rules relating to the admission for the year 2026. Candidates are required to go through the Prospectus carefully and acquaint themselves with all the relevant information. Candidates are also requested to visit the official website of the KUHS (www.kuhs.ac.in) regularly for further notifications and announcements. The selection is based on the Entrance examination conducted by KUHS. The Intake of students is limited to 24 per year or as decided by the University.

2. Centre

The programme shall be conducted through the School of Public Health. It is a School established under Kerala University of Health Sciences in 2018, located in Medical College Campus, Thiruvananthapuram.

3. Objectives of SPH

- 3.1** To provide quality education and training in public health for developing competent professionals and leaders in the health sector.
- 3.2** To strengthen research and epidemiological capacity through training in research methodology, biostatistics, disease surveillance, and outbreak investigation.
- 3.3** To generate and translate evidence for public health practice and policy through interdisciplinary research and knowledge dissemination.
- 3.4** To support health systems strengthening and health policy development through research, analysis, and capacity-building initiatives.
- 3.5** To promote ethical, equitable, and community-oriented public health practice that addresses the health needs of diverse populations.
- 3.6** To address local, national, and global health challenges through collaboration, innovation, and multidisciplinary approaches, including One Health principles.

4. Academic Activities

SPH conduct two-year MSc Advanced Clinical Epidemiology(Part-time) as distant programme, regular International, National and State level workshops on topics of public Health importance, research methodology and Biostatistics workshops, certificate programme in Evidence based Medicine, Cause of

death and lactation management, intramural and extra mural projects and now offering full-time post-graduate program MPH (HSMEGH)

5. About the Programme - MPH (HSMEGH)

The MPH (HSMEGH) designed to develop competent public health professionals from diverse academic backgrounds such as graduates in Health Sciences, Veterinary Sciences, Fisheries and Agricultural Sciences. The programme equips learners with advanced competencies in health systems management, epidemiology, public health leadership, research and global health, enabling them to effectively address contemporary public health challenges at local, national, and international levels. The programme follows a Credit and Semester System with outcome-based education. It is a two-year full-time postgraduate programme consisting of four semesters. The programme prepares graduates to compete, succeed, and excel in diverse public health settings by fostering analytical thinking, leadership, interdisciplinary collaboration, and a commitment to improving population health and health equity.

Career Opportunities

- **Public Health Research:** The programme provides strong training in epidemiology, biostatistics, implementation research, and health systems research, preparing graduates for careers in public health research institutions, universities, think tanks, and national and international research organizations. Graduates may also pursue doctoral studies in public health and related disciplines.
- **Epidemiology and Disease Surveillance:** Graduates can pursue careers in epidemiology, disease surveillance, outbreak investigation, health intelligence, and public health emergency preparedness within government agencies, healthcare organizations, research institutions, and international health agencies.
- **Health Systems Management:** The programme equips graduates with competencies in health planning, programme management, healthcare quality improvement, health economics, and strategic leadership, enabling them to assume managerial and leadership roles in healthcare organizations, public health programmes, and health systems.
- **Global Health and International Development:** Graduates can contribute to global health initiatives, humanitarian programmes, international development projects, and health policy implementation through positions in international organizations, non-governmental organizations, and global health partnerships.
- **Public Health Policy and Consultancy:** The programme prepares graduates to engage in health policy analysis, programme evaluation, health technology assessment, and evidence-informed decision-making as policy analysts, consultants, and advisors in governmental and non-governmental sectors.

- **Academia and Higher Studies:** Graduates may pursue advanced research and doctoral programmes in public health, epidemiology, health systems, global health, health economics, implementation science, and related disciplines, leading to careers in teaching, research, and academic leadership.

6. Description of the Programme

Graduates will be able to analyze population health data, design and evaluate public health interventions, manage health systems, conduct epidemiological research and contribute to global health initiatives.

6.1 Programme objectives:

- To develop competent public health professionals capable of designing and executing strategies to promote and preserve population health. Graduates will be equipped to lead and manage regional, national, and international public health programs with efficiency and strategic foresight.
- To provide a rigorous foundation in the core pillars of public health, including epidemiology, health systems science, and research methodology. This objective emphasizes the synthesis of health policy analysis to formulate and implement evidence-based interventions across diverse healthcare settings.
- To cultivate expertise in health systems management and leadership. This includes proficiency in human resources and financial management, quality improvement, Health Technology Assessment (HTA), and cost-effective decision-making to optimize healthcare delivery and organizational performance.
- To equip professionals with advanced analytical tools for rapid public health action. Key competencies include field epidemiology, robust data analytics, disease surveillance, outbreak investigation, and implementation research to address emerging health threats.
- To foster ethical, culturally responsive leadership and communication skills that empowers graduates to lead interdisciplinary teams. This objective focuses on building community partnerships and advancing advocacy efforts to ensure equitable access to effective healthcare services.

6.2 Programme Specific Outcomes (PSO) for MPH (HSMEGH)

- Epidemiological & Technical Proficiency:** Apply advanced epidemiological and bio statistical methods to investigate disease patterns, manage outbreaks, and analyse environmental health data. Graduates will demonstrate technical competence in field epidemiology and data analytics to support rapid public health action and disaster management.
- Health Systems Management & Strategic Leadership:** Demonstrate professional competency in managing healthcare organizations by applying principles of human resources, inventory, and financial

management. Graduates will be equipped to optimize hospital operations and health delivery systems to improve organizational efficiency and patient outcomes.

- iii. **Policy Analysis & Global Health Governance:** Analyse and formulate evidence-based health policies and public health acts within the context of the Indian Health System and International Health Regulations (IHR). Graduates will evaluate the impact of global health trends, including "One Health" and planetary resilience, on national policy frameworks.
- iv. **Economic Evaluation & Health Technology Assessment (HTA):** Evaluate the cost-effectiveness of health programs and technologies using Health Technology Assessment (HTA) principles. Graduates will utilize economic evaluation workshops to inform resource allocation and evidence-based decision-making within universal health coverage (UHC) frameworks.
- v. **Scientific Research & Collaborative Advocacy:** Design and execute primary public health research, culminating in a formal dissertation and the submission of a peer-reviewed manuscript. Graduates will exhibit ethical leadership and cultural competence while engaging in interdisciplinary teamwork and advocacy for equitable health services.

7. Eligibility for Admission

- 7.1** Candidates who have completed undergraduate degree courses in health science subjects belonging to Medical / Dental / Ayurveda / Unani / Siddha/ Homeopathy / Nursing / Pharmacy / Allied Health streams from KUHS or courses deemed as equivalent by the KUHS and who have registered under the respective councils (as applicable) of the state are eligible to pursue the programme.
- 7.2** Graduates in Veterinary Sciences, Fisheries, Agricultural Sciences, are also eligible to pursue the programme and should be registered under the respective councils as applicable.
- 7.3** In-service candidates from DME, DHS and ESI having eligibility as per clause 7.1 above, are eligible to apply for the course. They should submit a Non-Objection Certificate from the concerned authority at the time of admission.
- 7.4** No degrees earned through a correspondence course will be considered as eligibility for seeking admission to the course.
- 7.5** The maximum age limit of the candidate shall not be more than fifty years as on 31st December of the admission year.
- 7.6** A candidate seeking admission under KUHS must be an Indian National. Candidates having Overseas Citizen of India card or Nationality other than India shall be admitted under KUHS, only if permitted by the government.
- 7.7** A candidate seeking admission under KUHS must be certified as Medically fit to undergo the programme by an official competent for the same.
- 7.8** There shall be no provision of stipend for the Programme.

8. The medium of instruction:

The medium of instruction and examination will be in English.

9. Mode of Selection

- i. The Selection of candidates/in-service candidates for the course is based on the entrance examination conducted by the university.
 - ii. A separate rank list will be published for general candidates and in-service candidates.
 - iii. The screening Entrance Examination will comprise of multiple-choice questions that assess basic undergraduate subject knowledge with total marks of 100. There will be no negative marks.
- Distribution of marks for the entrance exam

- iv. Admission shall be made based on the rank list approved by the AC-CSS.
- v. Transfer during the Programme is not permitted.

Intake of students is limited to **24** per year.

Note:

- i. The seats unavailed by the SC candidates will go to the ST candidates and vice versa in the final allotment.

- ii. The seats unavailed by the SC/ST candidates will be filled from OEC Category. Seats unavailed by OEC candidates will be allotted to General merit candidates in the final allotment.
- iii. The seats unavailed by SEBC candidates will be allotted to General Merit candidates in the final allotment.
- iv. Seats unavailed by EWS candidates will go to General Merit.
- v. In the absence of eligible candidates, the vacant seats in Service Candidates category may be converted to General merit.

11.1 Reservation for Persons with Disabilities (PwD)

5% seats of the sanctioned strength shall be created, over and above for Physically Handicapped candidates with benchmark disabilities for all courses in Govt./Aided Colleges/ Cost-Sharing Colleges as stipulated in Section 32, Chapter VI of the Persons with Disabilities Act 2016. As per Clause 2(r), Chapter I of the Act, 'Person with benchmark disability' means a person with not less than 40% of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority. Generally, Candidates who have a minimum of 40% disability alone will be eligible to apply this quota. A disability certificate from the District Medical Board has to be uploaded while submitting application online. Such candidates are also directed to produce a certificate obtained from a Medical officer not below the rank of Assistant Surgeon to ensure the fitness of candidates to undergo the course at the time of admission.

11.2 Reservation for In-Service candidates

10% of the seats are reserved for the in-service candidates from DME, DHS and ESI. The selection is based on the Entrance examination conducted by KUHS. They should submit a Non-Objection Certificate from the concerned authority at the time of admission.

12. Claim for Reservations

Claims for Special/Mandatory reservations must be made by a candidate in the online application and the supporting documents shall be uploaded at the time of submitting application. The claim has to be specified in the application in the respective places. Claims made after the last date of submission of application will not be entertained even if supporting evidences are produced. The claims for Special and Mandatory Reservation once made in the application cannot be altered by the candidate under any circumstances after final confirmation.

12.1 General Merit: The seats under the General merit will be filled purely on the basis of merit irrespective of the category/community to which the candidates belong.

12.2 Claim for Communal Reservation under Socially and Educationally Backward Classes (SEBC)

Reservation to the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes will be in accordance with the provisions contained in G.O.(P)208/66/Edn. dated 02.05.1966, G.O.(Ms) No.95/08/ SCSTDD dated 06.10.2008, GO(MS) No. 10/2014/BCDD dated: 23.05.2014, G.O.(P) No. 1/2015/BCDD dated: 01.01.2015, GO(MS) No. 4/2015/H.Edn. dated: 05.01.2015, GO(MS) No. 15/2015/H.Edn. dated: 19.01.2015, GO(MS) No. 03/2018/BCDD. dated: 09.04.2018, GO(MS) No. 05/2020/BCDD. dated: 16.03.2020, G.O(Rt)No.01/2022/BCDD dated:25.02.2022 and as amended from time to time and will be in accordance with the Orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India/ Hon'ble High Court of Kerala or Orders of the Government of Kerala/ Government of India.

(a) Candidates belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes as per G.O.(P) 208/66/Edn. dated 02.05.1966, GO(MS) No. 10/2014/BCDD dated: 23.05.2014, G.O.(P) No. 1/2015/BCDD dated: 01.01.2015, GO(MS) No. 4/2015/H.Edn. dated: 05.01.2015 and GO(MS) No. 15/2015/H.Edn. dated: 19.01.2015 should upload to the online application, a certificate to the extent that the candidate belongs to the community which is designated as a Socially and Educationally Backward Class and does not belong to the category of Creamy Layer. The names of castes and communities under SEBC are given in Annexure 1. Only the claims of the candidates of those communities that are included in the list as incorporated in the respective Annexure of the Prospectus 2026 will be considered. Claims by candidates belonging to other communities, which are not included in the Annexure, will be rejected even if certificates from the concerned Revenue Officers have been obtained and uploaded to the online application.

(b) Candidates belonging to Ezhava, Muslim, Other Backward Hindus, Latin Catholic & Anglo Indians, Dheevara and related communities, Viswakarma and related communities, Kusavan and related communities, Other Backward Christian and Kudumbi communities, claiming reservation under SEBC Quota should invariably upload Non-Creamy Layer certificate in the prescribed format for State Government Education purpose obtained from the Village Officer concerned.

(c) Reservation under SEBC for children of inter-caste married couples: Children of Inter-caste married couple with either the father or mother belonging to a community included in SEBC list, or with father and mother belonging to different communities, both of which are included in the SEBC list, are eligible for reservation under SEBC. Such candidates should upload a Non-Creamy Layer certificate for State Education Purpose specifying the community of the candidate from the Village Officer.

(d) Candidates who are children of Inter-Caste married couple of whom one is SC/ST, will be eligible for educational and monetary benefits admissible to SC/ST as per Para 2 (ii) of G.O.(MS)No.25/2005/SCSTDD dated 20.06.2005, if eligible for reservation under SEBC, will be granted

the same, based on the Non-Creamy Layer Certificate for State Education Purpose obtained from the Village Officer and the inter-caste marriage certificate issued by the Tahsildar to be uploaded to the online application.

(e) The candidature/ allotment/ admission of the candidates who furnish fake Non-Creamy Layer certificates are liable to be cancelled.

12.3 Claim for Reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Quota

(a) Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe candidates should obtain the caste/ community certificate which should be uploaded while submitting application (See Annexure 2 & 3 for the list of SC/ST communities). SC/ST community status of children of parents contracted inter-caste marriage will be subject to the orders/clarification issued in G.O(MS) No.25/2005/ SCSTDD dated 20- 06-2005 and the judgment dated 10-08-2005 of the Full Bench of the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala in WP 2483/2005 and connected cases and G.O(MS) No.109/2008/SCSTDD dated 20.11.2008.

(b) As per G.O.(MS)No.109/2008/SCSTDD, dated 20.11.2008, the children born of inter- caste married couple of which one of the parents is SC/ST can claim the status of SC/ST on proof of the conditions of acceptance, customary traits and tenets under which such children are brought up.

(c) The competent authority issuing SC/ST community certificate to children born of intercaste married couple, of which one of the parents is SC/ST, should ensure that the claimant is subjected to same social disabilities and following the same customs and traditions and the community has accepted that person to its fold as such. The authority to issue caste certificate should also ensure that

- Each case shall be examined individually in the light of the existing facts and circumstances.
- The claimant has suffered disabilities – socially, economically and educationally.
- The society has accepted the claimant to their original fold as one among them and is living in the same social tenet.
- The Christian converts who have subsequently embraced Hinduism should upload caste/community certificate in the prescribed format while submitting the application. The following certificate should also be got recorded by the revenue official below the certificate “The certificate is issued after observing the guidelines issued in Government Circular No.18421/E2/SC/ STDD dated 15.12.1987”
- The applications for the reserved seats of Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes candidates which do not contain SC/ST Certificate (Community Certificate) from the Tahsildar in the online application will not be considered on any account for claiming community reservation against the

seat reserved for SC/ST candidates (vide G.O.(MS) 31/90/SCST/DD dated 25.05.1990). The candidates who are reconverted to Hinduism from Christianity, of Scheduled Caste origin, should upload community certificate from the Tahsildar concerned, to the online application, along with a copy of Gazette Notification regarding re-conversion. Such candidates should also upload the Sudhi Certificate and relevant page of the school documents of the candidate and his/her parents.

- The SC/ST claims in respect of those who have migrated from one State to another will be subject to the provisions of G.O (MS) No.10/86/SC/STDD dated 12.2.1986. Only the children of those who had migrated to this State before the promulgation of the Constitution (Scheduled Castes) Order 1950 and the Constitution (Scheduled Tribes) Order 1950 and ordinarily reside in this State can claim SC/ST benefits from the State of Kerala. They must be able to prove this, if required. SC/ST claims in respect of candidates whose parents were natives of other states but migrated to the state of Kerala before 1950 shall upload documents of migration also.

12.4 Claim of OEC candidates against the unavailed seats of SC/ST candidates: Other Eligible Community (OEC) candidates are eligible for the unavailed seats, if any, under SC/ST quota, as per GO(P) No. 135/87/H.Edn, dated 06.05.1987. They should specify their community status in the application. Such candidates should upload “Non-Creamy Layer Certificate” for State Government Education Purpose from the authority concerned in the proforma given in Annexure 5 as per GO(P)No.1/2015/BCDD dated 1/1/2015 and G.O(Ms)No.4/2015/H.Edn dated 5/1/2015. Relaxation in marks in the qualifying examination as in the case of SEBC candidates will be applicable to OEC candidates (As per GO(P) No.53/2000/SCSTDD dated 03.07.2000). The list of Other Eligible Communities is given in Annexure 4 (a) of the Prospectus.

WARNING:

1. Those who produce false SC/ST Certificate for claiming reservation under SC/ST quota shall be liable for the penalties stipulated in Section 15 of the Act referred to in Clause (C) above. Candidates and their parents who make such applications are warned that in addition to prosecution they will have to suffer the following consequences, in case the SC/ST certificate produced is found to be false and the candidate does not belong to any SC/ST communities, under Section 16 of the Act "Benefits secured on the basis of false community certificates will be withdrawn:"

2. Whoever not being a person belonging to any of the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes secures admission in any educational institution against a seat reserved for such castes or tribes or secures any appointment in the Government, Government Undertakings, Local Authority or in any other Company or Corporation owned or controlled by the Government or in any aided institution against a post reserved for such castes or tribes or enjoys any other benefits intended exclusively for such castes or tribes by producing

a false community certificate shall, on cancellation of the false community certificate, be removed by cancelling the irregular admission in the concerned educational institution, or as the case may be, removed from the said service forthwith and any benefit enjoyed by him as aforesaid shall be withdrawn forthwith.

3. Any amount paid to such person by the Government or any other agency by way of scholarship, grant, allowance, stipend or any other financial benefit shall be recovered as if it is arrears of public revenue due on land.

4. Any degree, diploma or any other educational qualifications acquired by such person after securing admission in any educational institution on the basis of a false community certificate shall also stand cancelled on cancellation of the community certificate obtained by him.

12.5 Claim for reservation of candidates belonging to general candidates, who are classified as EWS

To avail reservation for Economically Weaker Sections in general category (EWS) the candidates should upload necessary certificates from concerned Village officer (Annexure 6/ Annexure 8) to be considered under this category. The annual family income for EWS category candidates shall not exceed Rs.4 lakhs (Four Lakhs) as per G.O.(Ms)No.2/2020/P&ARD dated 12.02.2020. There is no income limit to those EWS candidates belonging to Anthyodaya/Annayojana and Priority House Hold.

13. Claims for Fee Concessions

13.1 Claim for fee concession to OEC Candidates listed in Annexure 4(a): Candidates belonging to Other Eligible Communities are exempted from payment of fee at the time of allotment to professional Degree Courses under Government/Community quota as per G.O. (MS) No. 36/07/SCSTDD dated 03.07.2007. Those OEC candidates who have uploaded the Non-Creamy Layer Certificate for availing the applicable reservation will be granted the fee concession based on the Non-Creamy Layer Certificate. But those OEC candidates who do not come under Non-Creamy Layer Category should upload the Community Certificate obtained from the village officer to the online application for availing the fee concession.

13.2. Claim for fee concession to the candidates belonging to communities listed in Annexure 4 (b): Candidates belonging to the communities listed in Annexure 4 (b) whose annual family income is up to Rs.6 lakhs are exempted from payment of fee at the time of allotment to Professional Degree Courses under Government/Community Quota as per GO (MS) No. 10/2014/BCDD dated: 23.05.2014. They should upload Community and Income Certificates from the Village Officer in the prescribed format to the online application.

14. Application Fee:

Application fee, is Rs.2500/- for General category and Rs.2000/- for SC/ST categories. The application fee is non-refundable under any circumstances.

15. Course fee:

- a. The total duration is four semesters.
- b. The tuition fee is Rs. 50,000/- per semester.
- c. Additional fee to be paid at the start of 1st semester:
 - i. Student Registration fee, Certificate Verification, Identity card, University Union fee and Sports fee: Rs.3885/-

- d. The Examination fee should be remitted separately to the University as per direction from the University from time to time.

16. Provision for Liquidated Damages:

- i. A bond in the prescribed format for an amount of Rs. 1,00,000 /- (Rupees One Lakh Only) shall be executed by the student at the time of registration to the programme towards liquidated damages in the event of discontinuation from the programme leaving the seat vacant.
- ii. In case a student leaves the programme after getting admission and the University is able to fill up the vacancy with another eligible student from the rank list, the remaining of the programme fee after deducting 10% as processing charges along with Caution deposit will be refunded.

Remittance of Fee

- (a) Candidates who get admission will have to remit admission fee, tuition fee and caution deposit online.
- (b) On remitting the fee, a fee receipt will be issued and it can be printed from the Online Payment page.
- (c) SC/ST/OEC and other candidates having fee concession, who get admission, shall remit an amount of Rs. 30,000/- (as Caution Deposit, which is refundable).

Important

Fee remitted by way of Demand Draft/Cheque etc. will not be accepted under any circumstances.

17. Accommodation

University does not provide residential accommodation for post-graduate students.

18. Submission of applications:

- i. Online facility for submitting application is available on KUHS website www.kuhs.ac.in
- ii. Copies of all relevant certificates should be uploaded along with the application form.
- iii. Candidates who had qualified from Universities outside Kerala should submit the eligibility certificate obtained from KUHS at the time of admission. Failure in production of Eligibility certificate will lead to rejection of the candidature.
- iv. Application Fee once paid will not be refunded. Applications not in the prescribed format, without the requisite documents and received after the last date fixed by the University will be summarily rejected.
- v. The University reserves the right to reject any application which is incomplete or not in accordance with the norms published by the University.

19. Documents to be furnished before the admitting authority:

- ii. Proof of Date of Birth/ Age: SSLC or equivalent/ Birth certificate

- vi. Economically Weaker Sections certificate (in the case of EWS Category)
- vii. Certificate of Disability from the Medical Board certifying the percentage of Degree of Disability (for claiming reservation under Person with Disability (PwD))
- viii. Transfer Certificate
- ix. Physical Fitness certificate from a Medical Officer not below the rank of an Assistant Surgeon
- x. Migration certificate (if applicable)
- xi. Nativity/ Domicile certificate

- xii. Passport size photo (3 no.s)
- Two attested copies of the above certificates should be submitted at the time of admission.
 - Additional documents: The candidates securing admission to the PG Course has to submit the anti-dowry declaration / undertaking in the format issued by Kerala University of Health Sciences.

20. Preventive Measures Against Ragging:

- a) According to the Kerala Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1998, “ragging” means doing of any act by disorderly conduct to a student of an educational institution, which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raising apprehension or shame or embarrassment to that student and includes teasing or abusing or playing practical jokes or causing hurt to such students or asking a student to do any act or to perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course be willing to do.
- b) All institutions will have to abide by the directives of the Honourable Supreme Court of India, Dated May 16, 2007 in SLP No. (S) 24295 of 2006 University of Kerala Vs Council, Principals, Colleges, Kerala & Ors [with SLP (C) No.24296-99/2004 & W.P (Crl) No. 173/2006 & SLP (C) No.14356/2005] and the recommendations approved by the Honorable Supreme Court of India on effective prevention of ragging in educational institutions.
- c) In case, the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he/she has indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the educational institution.
- d) It shall be the collective responsibility of the authority of the institution to see to it that effective steps for preventing ragging are taken.
- e) Anti-ragging committees and anti-ragging squads will have to be formed to take effective measures against ragging and they should adhere to the stipulations and effectively monitor and comply with the directives.
- f) Each of the student of the institution and his/her parents, or guardian are required to submit a combined undertaking (**given in annexure 10(a) and 10(b)**) at the time of registration which is mandatory for registration/admission.

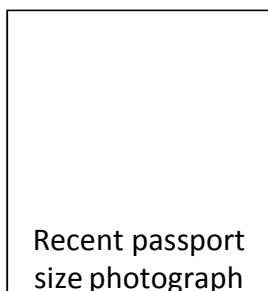

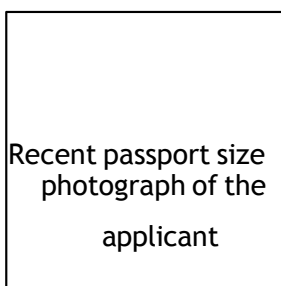
