Clause 5.3

In the marklists of Fourth, Sixth and Eighth semesters the marks of ELECTIVE MODULES are to be added. The marks obtained by students must be forwarded to University before the Examination. It is conducted as college exam and the percentage for pass needed is 40%. The name of the module completed by the student and the marks obtained by the student in the module out of 100 marks is to be submitted to KUHS. (Each module –(1 credit/20 hours) maximum marks-100) Electives are excluded in calculation of SGPA & CGPA.

The change in the grading system is to be made under Clause 5.3 Templates for marklists and clause 5.4 Transcripts
